To improve customers’ options further, TID has created two new residential rebate programs that will help customers beat the summer heat; radiant barriers and solar attic fans.

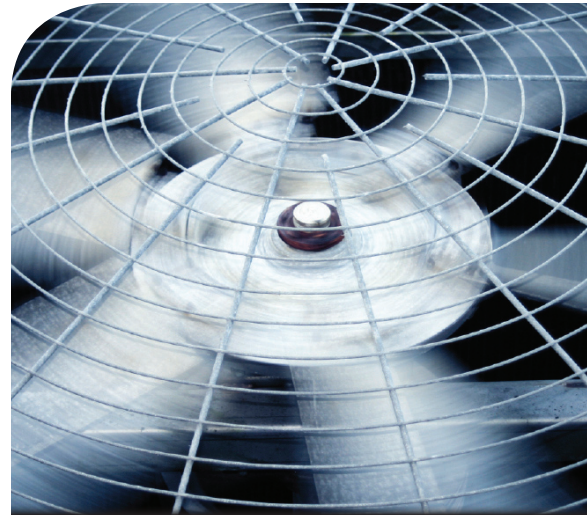
### Radiant Barriers

Radiant barriers reduce summer heat

gain and winter heat loss, which helps lower heating and cooling costs. Customers who install radiant barriers can receive a rebate from TID for \$0.10 per square foot of attic space.

### Solar Attic Fans

A cooler air temperature in the attic means a reduced amount of air conditioning needed to keep your house cool. Receive a \$100 rebate when you purchase and install a new solar attic fan.

## Informational meetings for Don Pedro relicensing set for Sept. 14-15

The Don Pedro Hydroelectric Project located on the Tuolumne River is owned jointly by the Turlock Irrigation District and the Modesto Irrigation District. The Project received its initial authorization for construction and operation from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) in 1964. This initial license expires in April, 2016, and the Districts intend to obtain a new license from FERC to continue to operate and manage the Project.

TID, in conjunction with MID will hold three initial informational meetings Sept. 14-15 regarding the relicensing of Don Pedro Dam and Powerhouse. The meetings, which are listed below, are scheduled for the public’s convenience. Each meeting will cover the same subjects. Members of the public who attend will learn about the federal relicensing process and relicensing schedule. ## TID Pool Pass Program

TID is in its second year of the Pool Pass Program. The program was created to promote water safety by encouraging children to swim in local public pools instead of canals and rivers. The passes have been distributed to local schools, recreation departments and at community events.

The passes can be taken to any community pool listed below and used to cover the fee for their open swim periods. Each community will return the vouchers to TID and will be reimbursed for the cost.

## Assistance available with TID CARES

Find out if you qualify for the TID CARES Program, which can save on your monthly energy bills.

Residential customers who qualify for the TID CARES Program receive a \$9 discount on the residential customer charge, as well as 15 percent off the first 800 kilowatt-hours (kWh) of use.

To be eligible for the CARES Program, customers must meet the following requirements:

- The total household's gross income must not exceed the TID Income Guidelines.



- You are not claimed as a dependent on another person's income tax return.
- The service address shown on the application is your primary residence.

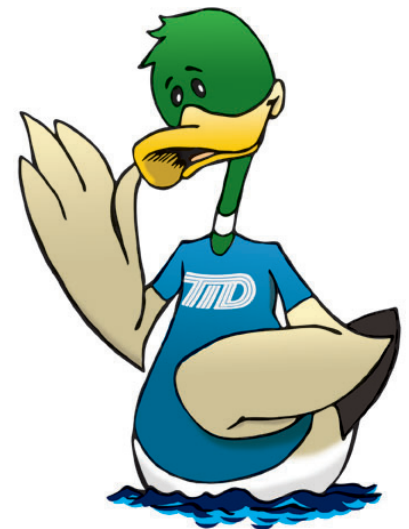
To see if you qualify for the CARES Program, you must complete a CARES application. Applications are available and can be submitted for approval at
